# SHEEPISH STRIPES

## Knitting Pattern

### What you'll need:

Yarn: Aran weight white 15g, orange yarn 5g and purple yarn 2g.

Needles size: 6mm or any needle size that meets gauge.

Gauge: 19 rows x 14 stitches = 10cm.

The square is knitted in garter stitch (knit all rows). You can cut the yarn between colour changes and weave in the ends at the end.



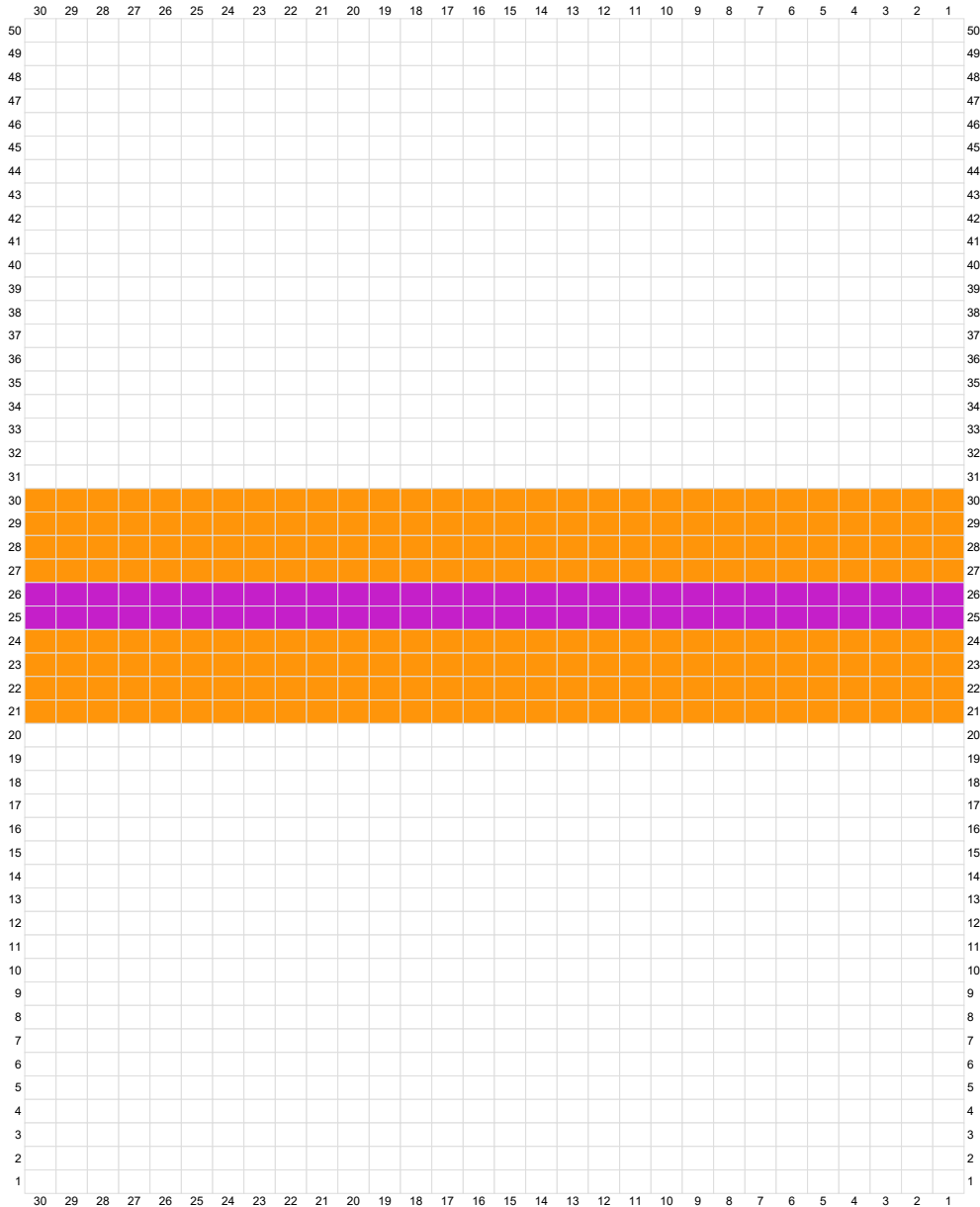
- 1 Cast on 30 stitches using the white yarn. (if you're not sure how to do this yet, go and check out our step-by-step guide at [shaunthesheep.com](http://shaunthesheep.com))
- 2 Knit 20 rows using your white yarn.
- 3 After the 20th row, cut the white yarn, leaving about a 6-inch tail.
- 4 Move on to knit 4 rows using your orange yarn, then cut the orange yarn, leaving about a 6-inch tail.
- 5 Knit 2 rows using your purple yarn, then cut the purple yarn, leaving about a 6-inch tail.
- 6 Knit 4 more rows using your Orange yarn, then cut the orange yarn leaving about a 6-inch tail.
- 7 Switch back to your white yarn and knit 20 rows.
- 8 Cast off your needle, and then simply use your knitting needle to weave each loose yarn end into the edge or back of your knitting – try to follow the stitch pattern so the ends are hidden neatly.
